To enter the Pediatric Unit, someone will press the door bell.




There is a playroom, with toys and activities to play with while I'm here.


I can choose to bring toys or a comfort item from home too!




There are wagons and cars I may be able to ride in, if my grown-ups and I want to go for a walk around the unit.

There will be a chair, that turns into a bed, for my grown-up to sleep next to me.





I will have a TV in my room and they can bring toys, activities, and games right to my hospital bed!

They may put stickers with strings on my body, under my hospital pajamas. These stickers tell them how my body is working.







Machines and computers make beeping noises at the hospital. I can choose to turn on some quiet music, a sound machine, or the TV.




While I am here, there are lots of friendly people to help take care of me and to check on my body. Someone may check my temperature with a wand that touches my forehead.



To check my heart, lungs, and belly, they will use a stethoscope. They will ask me to take deep breaths.







They will also check my blood pressure using a sleeve that gives my arm a hug.






My care team may wear a blue gown, gloves, and a mask! These items help keep their body and my body safe while in the hospital.
