How to Use an Ellipta

Using your inhaler properly is important when you have asthma or COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease).



Medications

An *Ellipta* is used with a number of different medications. These include:

- Anoro (umeclidinium plus vilanterol)
- Arnuity (flucticasone furoate)
- Breo (fluticasone furoate plus vilanterol)
- Incruse (umeclidinium)
- Trelegy (fluticasone furoate, umeclidinium, & vilanterol)











Checklist of Steps

- 1. Check dose counter. (Do not shake at any time.)
- 2. Slide cover down until a click is heard.
- 3. Breathe out gently (away from inhaler)
- 4. Put mouthpiece in mouth and close lips to form a good seal. (Do not block air vent with fingers.)
- 5. Breathe in steadily and deeply.
- 6. Hold breath for 5 seconds or as long as comfortable.
- 7. While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth.
- 8. Breathe out gently (away from inhaler)
- 9. Slide the cover upwards as far as it will go, to cover the mouthpiece.

Potential Errors and Tips

- Shaking the inhaler
- Opening and closing the mouthpiece without inhaling a dose
- Leaving the mouthpiece open
- Covering vent with hand
- Exhaling into or near the mouthpiece
- Not closing the cover after inhaling
- Do not open the mouthpiece until you are ready to inhale dose; if the mouthpiece is closed, the dose is lost
- Always close the cover after use
- If you are using this inhaler for a corticosteroid preventer medication, rinse your mouth with water and spit after inhaling the last dose to reduce the risk of side effects
